- Origins in the 2016 ***MBIE Research, Science, and Innovation Domain Plan*** and CONZUL (Council of NZ University Librarians) consultations in 2015-2016
- Formed in 2019 with 5 original members
- Last year: ~1800 DOIs minted across 8 members

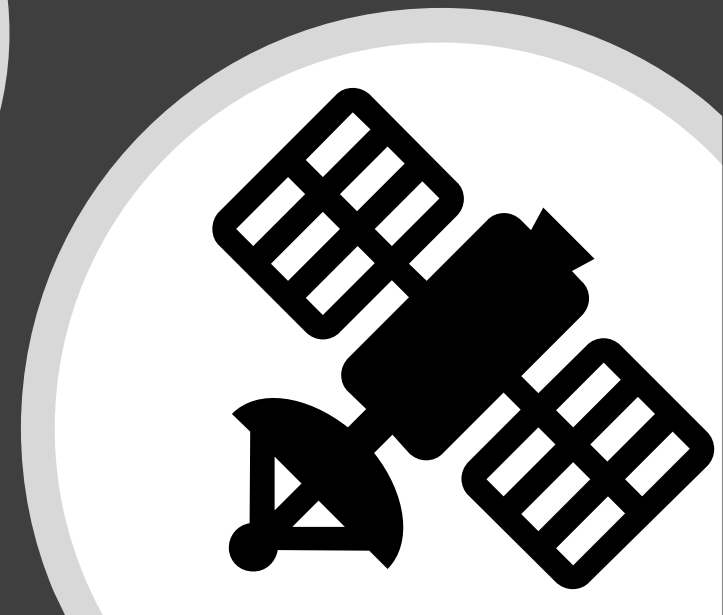
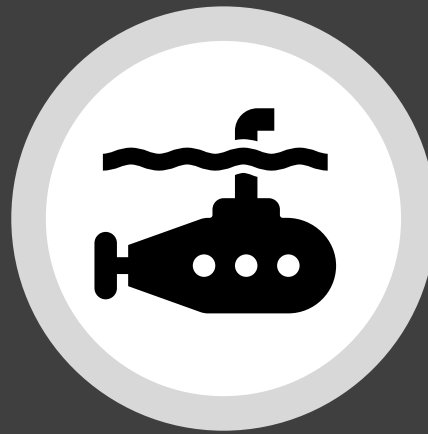
