



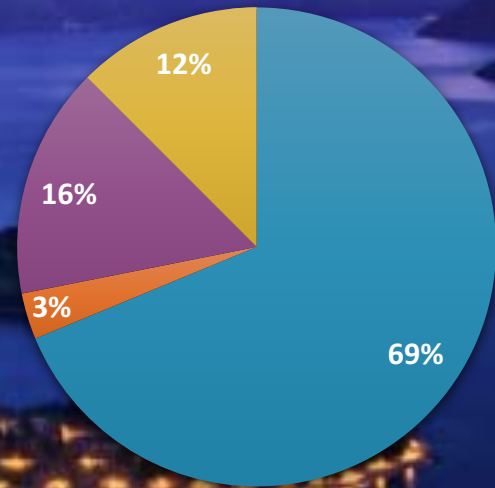

IN NEW ZEALAND

- 32 organizations (to date) have signed on as members of the Royal Society-led ORCID consortium
- NZ has the broadest membership of any consortium



■ Research Institute ■ Association ■ Funder ■ Hospital

ORCID CONSORTIA


- Consortium lead provides Tier 1 technical support, website, FAQ, and manages outreach among members
- All questions go through consortium lead
- ORCID provides documentation, Tier 2 technical support, issues API credentials, and manages inter-consortium communication
- Very important to share approaches among members
- Suggest at least quarterly check-in between consortium advisory group and ORCID

THE ORCID COMMUNITY

- Over 2.6 million researchers
- 536 members from 39 countries, including national consortia in the UK, Denmark, Finland, Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Italy, Taiwan, Australia, New Zealand and 4 regional consortia in the US
- Over 250 integrations in each sector of the research community

WHAT IS ORCID?

- An identifier for researchers
- A registry
- A set of standard procedures for connecting researchers to their affiliations and activities
- A committed community building connectors
- An international-scale open research effort



ORCID's vision is a world where all who participate in research, scholarship, and innovation are uniquely identified and connected to their contributions across disciplines, borders, and time.



ORCID is just another profile site. I already have a Research Gate account and a Google Scholar Profile. I don't need this too.



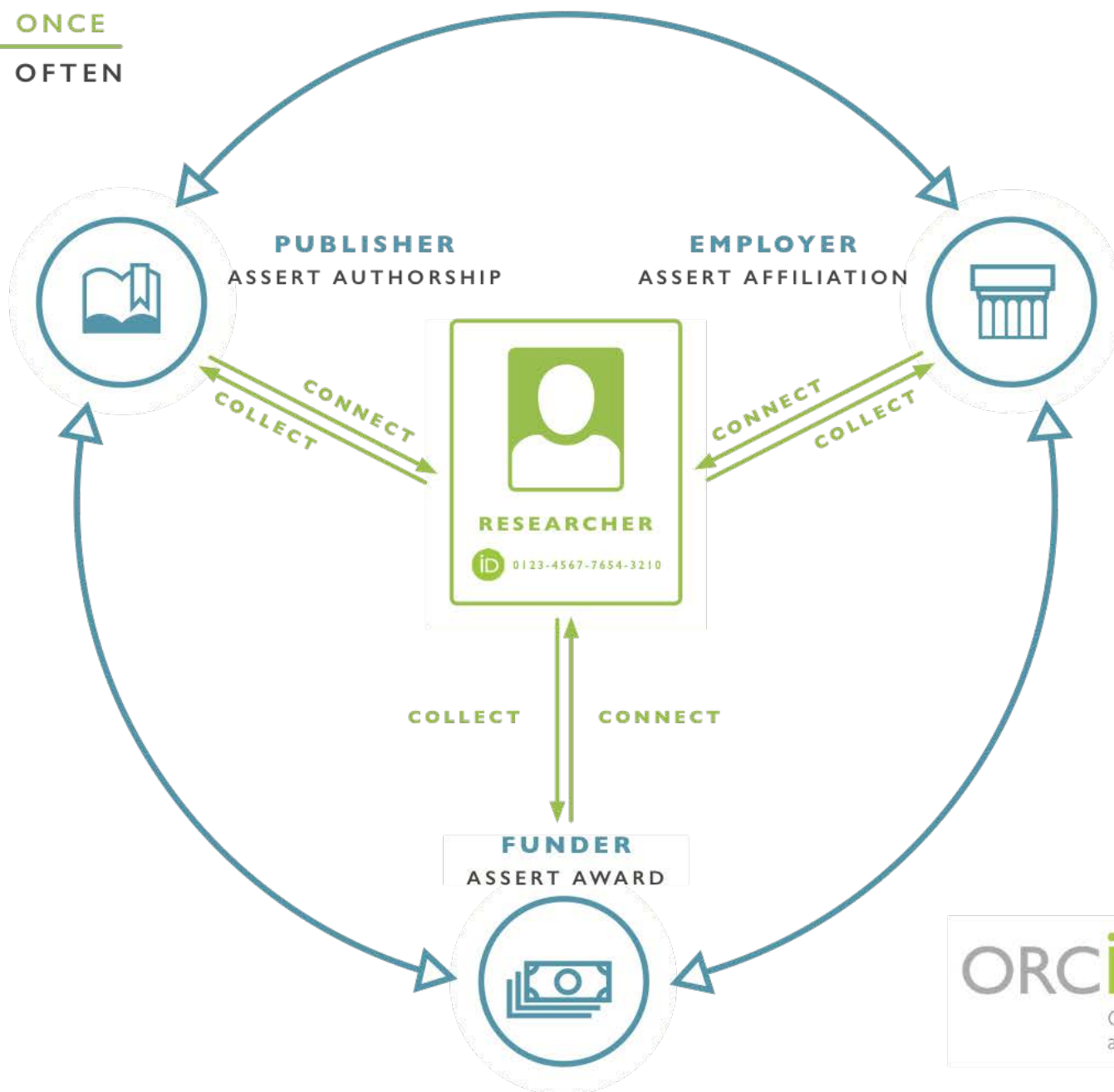
ORCID is just a list of my papers and some data about my work and education history. I already have an online CV. I don't need an ORCID to keep track of this.

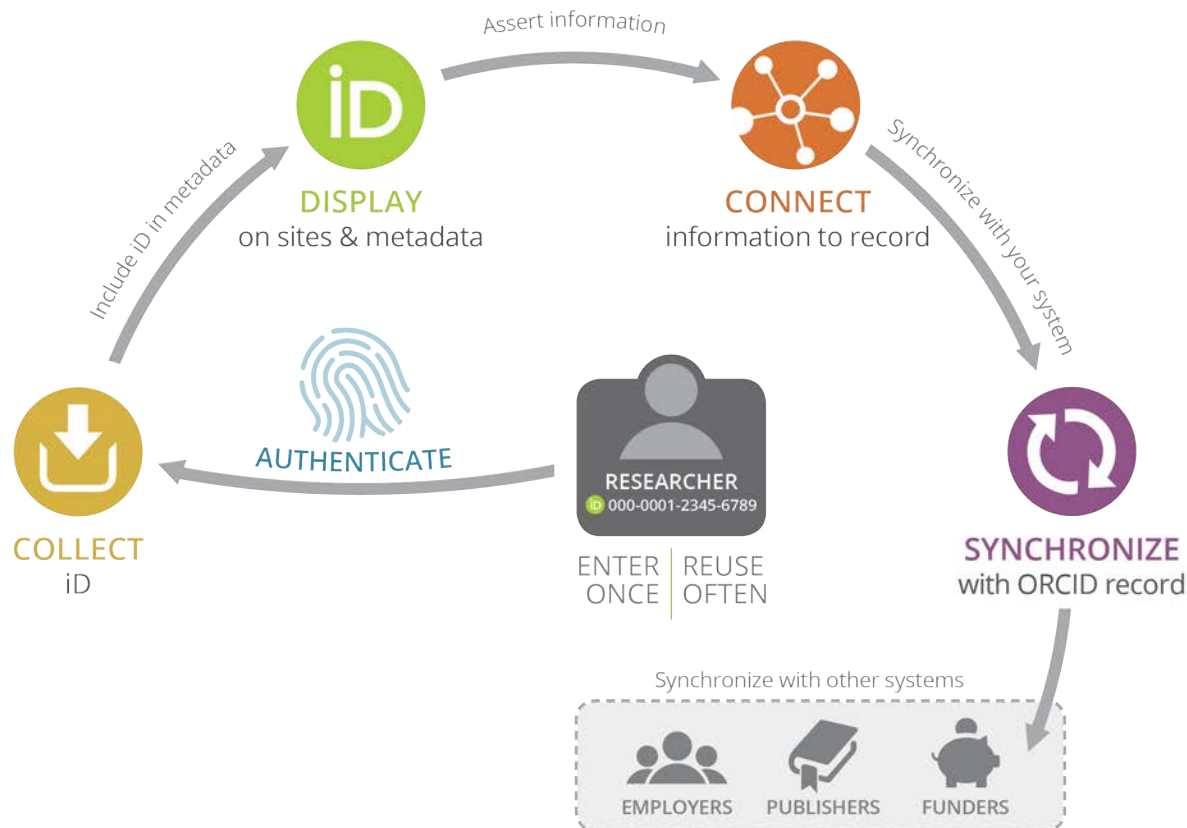
COLLECT AND CONNECT!

This ensures researchers and our members understand what ORCID is and why and how to engage.
